CAA member Dr John Hinwood's new book *You Can Expect a Miracle* is receiving excellent reviews and attracting extensive media coverage both here and overseas.

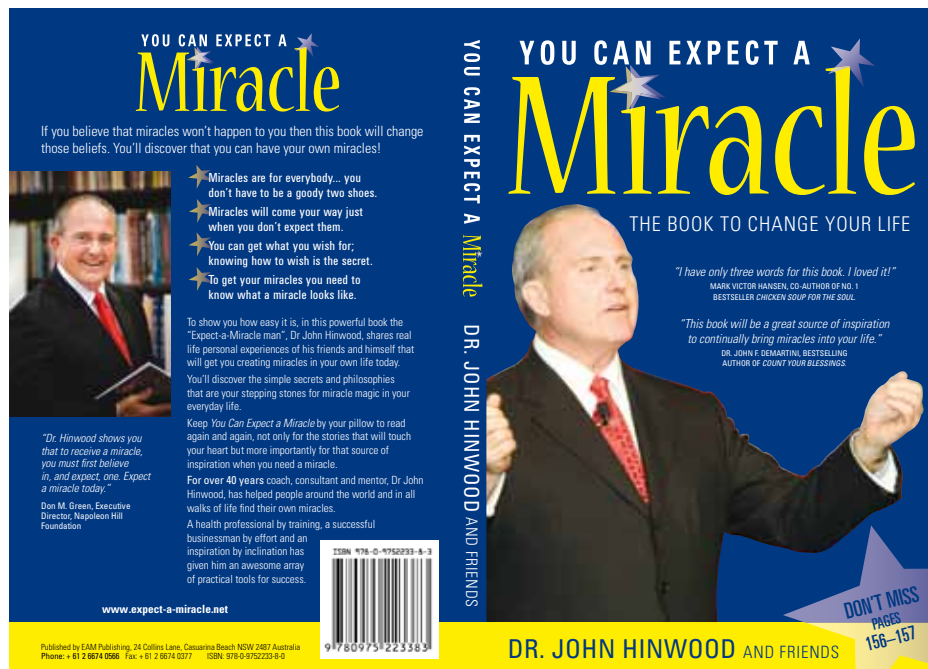
The book was recently released in Australia following a successful launch in America last year and was inspired by his mentor and close friend, Charles "Tremendous" Jones.

Charles was the president and founder of US publishing company Executive Books and *You Can Expect a Miracle* was the last book he published before he passed away in October last year.

Dr Hinwood believes that most of us are conditioned to expect the worse, but the simple act of expecting the best (or a miracle) can be enough to turn around peoples' lives.

For the past 21 years, Dr Hinwood has been on a mission to educate everyone he meets and has a unique way of communicating his message. He hands out plain white business cards with just three words printed on it – 'Expect a Miracle'.

"I have witnessed great changes in people after they receive this card. They start to notice small miracles



such as their baby smiling or a friendly gesture from a complete stranger," he said.

"It has been scientifically proven that the power of intention can and does change lives. Everyone needs to expect a miracle every day.

"If people expect miracles, they are well on the way to regaining their health."

Dr Hinwood has handed out more than 70,000 cards to patients, friends and strangers in his local community, across Australia and around the world

The book continues to spread this message, comprising brief accounts of miracles from around the globe.

Dr Hinwood said the book had generated numerous articles in the print media and radio interviews on 2UE in Sydney, ABC South Australia and radio stations in New York and Los Angeles, to name a few.
